A public talk on Pulsars will be conducted in IISER, Pune

PUNE: Exciting Science Group will organise its next segment of 'Popular Science Talk' titled 'Twinkle Twinkle Little Pulsar' on Sunday, November 24 between 10am and 11:15 am. The lecture will be held at New Lecture Hall, Smt Indrani Balan Science Activity Centre, Indian Institute of Science Education and Research, Pune.

Ramana Athreya, Associate Professor (Physics), at Indian Institute of Science Education and Research will be the speaker at the event. 'Pulsars are exotic remnants of very large stars which have run their course in life. The speaker will introduce the audience to a brief history of the life of stars, leading to the birth of a pulsar in some cases. He will then describe

some of their unusual features and the role they have played in our larger understanding of astrophysics,' said the official notification about the event.

The lecture is ideal for students studying in class VII to X, however, other students too can attend the program. Registration is free of cost for the event and seating is on a first-come-first-serve basis.
