IISER professor wins prestigious EMBO YIP

PUNE: European Molecular Biology Organisation (EMBO)'s has selected 27 life scientists from across the world and Siddhesh Kamat, assistant professor in the Biology department at Indian Institute of Science Education and Research is one of them. His selection as a Young Investigator is for a period of four years starting from January 2020.

EMBO Young Investigators enjoy a range of benefits to support them in their careers, that include access to core facilities at European Molecular Biology Laboratory (EMBL) in Heidelberg, Germany, additional research funding, networking and training opportunities, and an award. Siddhesh Kamat's group studies biological processes involved in lipid signaling and metabolism in the nervous and immune system," said the release from IISER.
